Creatures of the Night

A Witch's Brew of Bats and Beasts

- The Bay Area's nocturnal fauna includes 12 species of bats and much more—see what else is out and about in the dark
- Separate day, night, and maternity roosts give many bats multiple homes
- Some bats eat 600 mosquitoes in an hour, but not all feed on flying insects—what else is on their menu?
- Automated bat-monitoring stations reveal the movements and lifestyles of local bats
- Bat vocalizations can be lowered into the range of human hearing—would you like to hear what a bat sounds like?
