The USGS Menlo Park Campus is located at 345 Middlefield Road in Menlo Park

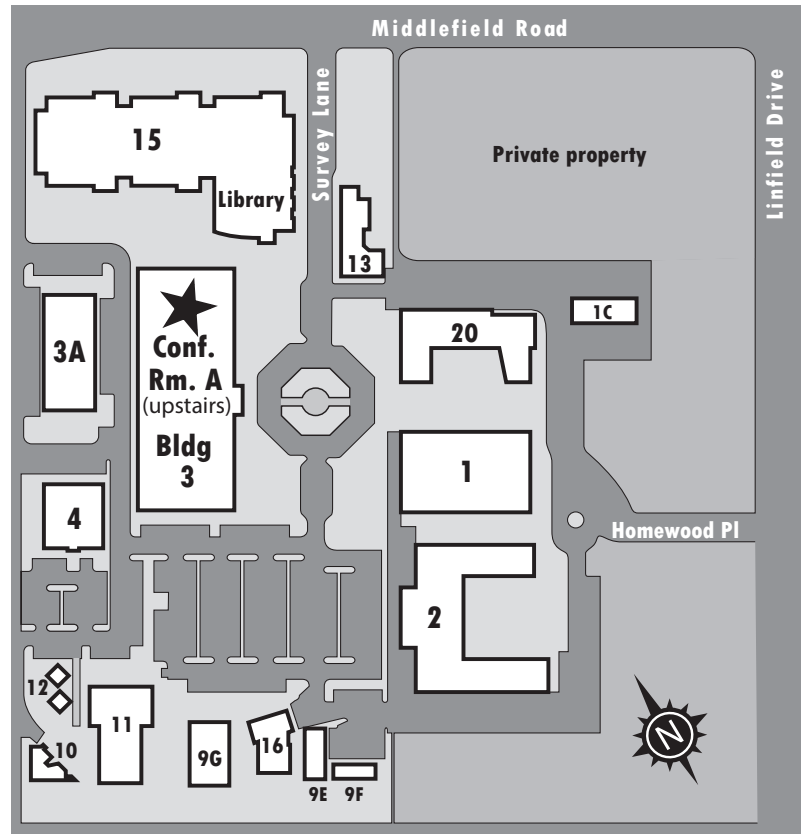
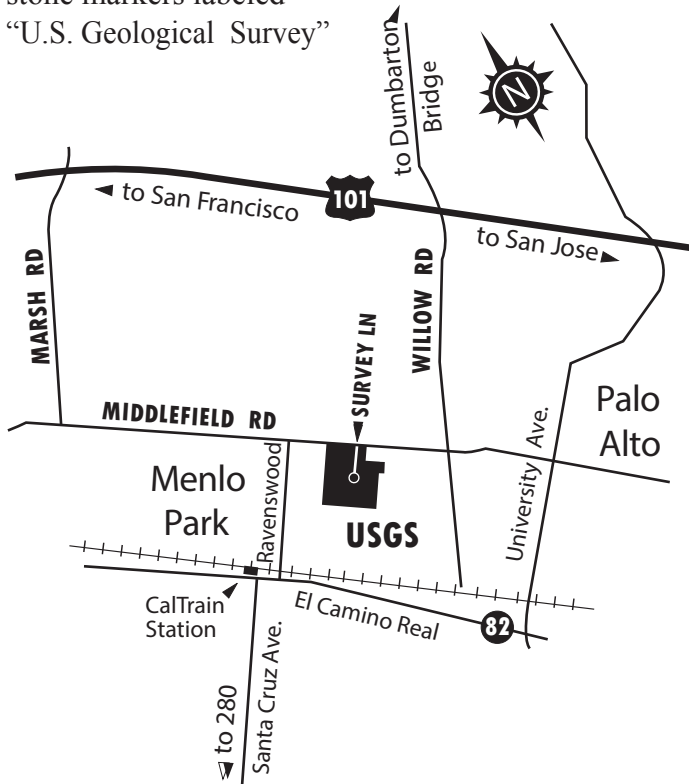
From San Francisco
